**"AN ACT CONCERNING CHILDREN'S BEHAVIORAL HEALTH, A
STANDARD SELF-EMPLOYMENT EXPENSE DEDUCTION FOR
TEMPORARY FAMILY ASSISTANCE, THE
TELECOMMUNICATIONS SURCHARGE TO SUPPORT THE
FIREFIGHTERS CANCER RELIEF PROGRAM, COURTHOUSE
OPERATIONS, DATA PROTECTION AND PROCEDURES FOR
REDISTRICTING AND CORRECTING DISTRICTING ERRORS."**

1 After the last section, add the following and renumber sections and
2 internal references accordingly:

3 "Sec. 501. (NEW) (*Effective January 1, 2026*) (a) For the purposes of this
4 section:

5 (1) "Law enforcement officer" means a sworn member or
6 representative of a local, state or federal law enforcement authority; and

7 (2) "Personally identifying information" means:

8 (A) Any information that can be used to distinguish or trace the

9 identity of a law enforcement officer or a member of such law
10 enforcement officer's family, including, but not limited to, a name, prior
11 legal name, alias, mother's maiden name, Social Security number, date
12 or place of birth, address or telephone number;

13 (B) Any information that is linked or linkable to a law enforcement
14 officer or a member of such law enforcement officer's family, such as
15 medical, financial, education, consumer or employment information,
16 data or records;

17 (C) Any information that is linked or linkable to the workplace or
18 hours of work of a law enforcement officer's or a member of such law
19 enforcement officer's family; and

20 (D) Any other information that provides the date, time or place where
21 a law enforcement officer or a member of such law enforcement officer's
22 family may be located.

23 (b) A person is guilty of harassing a law enforcement officer when
24 such person, for no legitimate purpose and with intent to harass,
25 terrorize or alarm, discloses a law enforcement officer's personally
26 identifiable information without consent of the law enforcement officer,
27 knowing, that under the circumstances, such disclosure would cause a
28 reasonable law enforcement officer to fear for such law enforcement
29 officer's physical safety or the physical safety of a third person.

30 (c) For the purposes of this section, a violation may be deemed to have
31 been committed either at the place where the communication originated
32 or at the place where it was received.

33 (d) Harassing a law enforcement officer is a class D felony."
