REASONS FOR BILL:

The bill addresses the overlap of responsibilities within the Department of Developmental Services' (DDS') Independent Mortality Review Board the Fatality Review Board. Specifically, it will:

- Modify the DDS Independent Mortality Review Board's responsibilities by removing a statutory reference to Executive Order 57. This 2017 executive order established two boards that review and investigate certain deaths of people with intellectual disabilities under DDS care.
- Codify provisions of the executive order and generally merges the responsibilities of the two boards, thereby eliminating the need for the Fatality Review Board.
- Allow DDS to add members to the Independent Mortality Review board it deems as beneficial, so long as the majority of the board's members are not DDS employees.

SUBSTITUTE LANGUAGE:

The substitute language makes a technical change.

RESPONSE FROM ADMINISTRATION/AGENCY:

Jordan A. Scheff, Commissioner, Department of Developmental Services (DDS):

This bill revises the current statute that outlines responsibilities of an Independent Mortality Review Board within DDS along with including a reference to Executive Order 57 that was

implemented by Governor Malloy in 2017. The Executive Order includes the make-up and some responsibilities of an Independent Mortality Review Board and Fatality Review Board. The responsibilities outlined in the Executive Order include similar requirements for both Boards which is leading to the duplication of efforts within the Department.

Clarifying and codifying these roles will streamline the review process, eliminate duplication of work, and ensure that the Independent Mortality Review Board can focus on their distinct mandate. The result will be a more efficient system that maintains accountability and strengthens oversight without the current unnecessary overlap.
