### ***OFA Fiscal Note***

#### ***Reduces Cost In Bill***

The amendment reduces the cost in the underlying bill by lengthening the period within which a peace officer must complete the required medical incident report from five days to 30 days and excluding employees of the Department of Mental Health and Addiction Services from the amendment's provisions.

While it is expected that most potentially impacted agencies will be able to absorb this requirement as part of ongoing operations, there remains a potential cost to various state agencies and municipal police departments to the extent they must incur overtime or modify reporting systems to meet the requirements of the amendment.
