Meeting Summary:

1. YSB Presentation by Erica Bromley (separate handout)
 - Discussion surrounding funding of YSBs in suburban and urban areas and its effect on prevention efforts
 - Discussion around data on the profiles of youth who are being referred to YSBs and how they compare the profiles of their community
 - Request for a flow chart explaining the organization and oversight of the YSBs and JRBs in the state

2. Review CCLP Scope of Work
 - The TA from CCLP will conclude in September. Given the short time-frame, CCLP will provide realistic recommendations for what can be effectively accomplished. The #4 option on the original TA summary is long-term and would no longer be an option.
 - Options to outline a set of goals for the front-end/diversion work in response to Erica Bromley's FWSN presentation
 - Discussion on the importance of building consistency and uniformity YSBs and JRBs and to get a clear vision for our work.
 - Discussion on the JJPOC Strategic Plan RED goals and objectives
 - Discussion on reaching out to DC and getting them involved in certain aspects of the work
 - Suggestion of combining the #2 and #3 option on the original TA summary in order to review of national best practices and receive guidance on how we look at the CT data

3. Next Steps

- RED Cochairs, TYJI, and CCLP will meet next week to narrow the CCLP Scope of Work and timeline based on the September date of conclusion
- A meeting before the regular August meeting will occur to review the new scope of work and those who are able to attend are welcome but it is not mandatory

- Erica Bromley and Charter Oak will be invited back to discuss more FWSN information at a future RED meeting
