Below are answers to the DOC questions from the 2/25/21 **Judicial and Corrections meeting.**

Q: How many vehicles does DOC lease through the DAS fleet?

A: DOC leases 544 vehicles through DAS Fleet

Q: Provide a breakdown of inmate medical workers per facility (how many IMS workers per facility, how many openings per facility).

A: Please see the Excel Spreadsheet attached to this email.

Q: Has any of the IMS medical costs been reimbursed through federal COVID funds?

A: No

Q: Current number of inmates who have a tablet?

A: As of 2/23 there are 1,848 Personal Tablets at MacDougall-Walker CI and Manson YI.

Q: Which facilities are the tablets in?

A: MacDougall-Walker CI and Manson YI

Q: When will tablets be available to all inmates?

A: All facilities should have tablets available for all eligible inmates within 4-6 months

Q: Was the tablet vendor selected via an RFP and competitive bidding process?

A: Yes there was an RFP managed by DAS and the vendor was selected through the competitive procurement process. DAS negotiated the resulting contract. The DAS contract is CN: 17PSX0027.

Q: Can you provide additional information regarding the tablets to inmates?

A: Below is the breakdown of charges for the tablets:

- Free to inmates: religious material, educational material, commissary check, file grievances, legal materials, job training.
- Messages to families cost 19.5 cents per message. This fee is collected by the vendor, the state doesn't receive any revenue from this.
- Games, videos, music, magazines have a cost to inmates and the revenue is split between the vendor and the state.

Q: Can you provide a comparison of salaries for nurses in DOC vs. the private sector?

A: According to the CT DOL Occupational Employment and Wages Report, Registered Nurses average annual salaries are typically between \$80K-\$95K depending on which field they are in. For example, the average salary for a Registered Nurse in a hospital is \$88K (link below).

According to DAS Job Classes, a 40 hour per week nurse in a correctional facility has a salary range of \$66K-\$87K per year (link below).

Q: Can you provide a breakdown of the inmate telephone call data?

A: The DOC has a contract with Securus Technologies to provide telephone services to the correctional facilities. The vendor charges fees for each phone call and the state collects 68% of the revenue (not including interstate revenue). The remaining revenue goes to the vendor to compensate them for providing the service.

The total revenue depends on how many calls are placed and for how long the calls last. Historically the annual revenue from this is approximately \$12-\$13 million with the state receiving \$7 to \$8 million. This money goes to DOC for expanding inmate educational services and reentry program initiatives, and the remainder pays for criminal justice information system (in DESPP) and for probation staffing in the Judicial Department.
