ⁱ The Smarter Balanced assessments report a student’s achievement in scale scores. The scale score is the most precise measure of student achievement. The Grade 3 scale ranges from 2114 to 2623. The scale is categorized into four achievement levels. Level 1: 2114-2366; Level 2: 2367 to 2431; Level 3: 2432-2489; Level 4: 2490-2623. The achievement levels are a reporting feature required under federal law. Students scoring in levels 3 and 4 are considered to have either met or exceeded the achievement standards while students scoring in levels 1 and 2 are considered to either have not met or are approaching the achievement standard. The minimum scale score for level 3 is 2432. There is no real difference in achievement between a student who scores 2432 (Proficient) and another who scores 2431 (Not Proficient). Overall proficiency is the percentage of tested students scoring in levels 3 or 4 i.e., at or above a scale score of 2432.

ⁱⁱ Characterizing student achievement simply in terms of the four achievement levels or as proficient/not-proficient is a gross oversimplification. State achievement tests should not be seen as pass/fail tests. Achievement exists on a continuum. All students scoring below the proficiency cut score should **not** be characterized as “students who cannot read”, while all students scoring above the proficiency cut score should not be viewed as experts.

ⁱⁱⁱ FRPM Eligible = Students who are eligible for free- or reduced-price meals.

^{iv} EL/ML = English learner/multilingual learner

^v High needs = students who are identified as either EL/ML, students with disabilities, or students who are FRPM eligible.

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
