I don't have a problem with that, but my main issue is that I am currently dealing with a Federal Court Complaint against three DOC employees and don't wish to be retaliated against or transfered for bring this issue once again because of the lack of attention that the last MWCI'S administration really didn't care much about following up on what was brought to their attention, but a new Warden is here and who knows if any of these conditions will be addressed and taken care of by the Maintenance Department.

1)-I am in the J-Unit-#2, and for the last two or more years the ceiling tiles a total of (8)eight tiles was removed because of the roof still has not as bad of leak issue, but still leaks when it a heavy rain period happens.

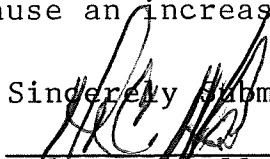
About 75% of the ceiling tiles are totally filthy and has been for years and I have been here since 2020, and they were like that before I left in 2014.

There are also a mold issue that has developed over the years and I personally brought this issue to three Wardens ago attention as well as the maintenance personnel attention. These tiles has been in place since the building was built 34 years ago and should be removed as well as the (MOLD) issue taken care off.

2)-The food portion size that we are issued on a daily bases isn't still meeting the right standards as it should be regularly, plus the food that is prepared at York C.I. in Niatic CT, should be made at each facility, or have a better quality of meat that is given, because most of the food that is issued is processed meat. (SOY MEAT AS WELL).

3)- This may be something a little hard to address, but the Inmates Pay Wages should be once again evaluated because an increase is needed.
